



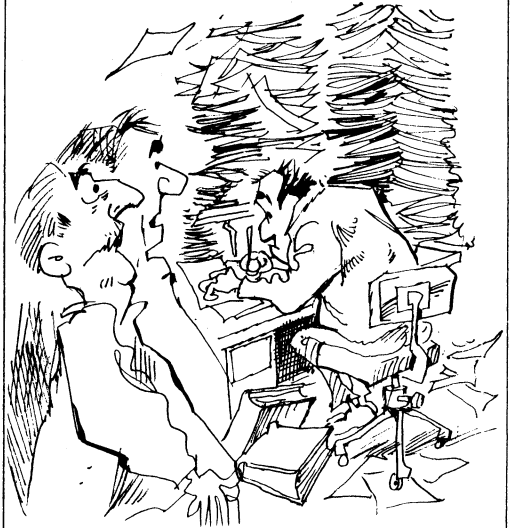
"I am sorry to announce that Professor Byrdbill just had a major nervous breakdown. For his research project he had been trying to count all the different parts and functions in a typical human cell."
